

COBRA PICTURE VARNISH



Auxiliaries have a positive effect on the durability of the paint. They influence the characteristics of the paint and make it even more versatile in use. There are 4 types of auxiliaries:

- Painting medium
- Glazing medium
- Painting paste
- Varnishes



Cobra picture varnishes determine the final degree of sheen and protect the painting against dirt and ageing. Cobra picture varnish is available in gloss, matt or satin.



With thin to normal paint layers the final varnish can be applied after 6–12 months. For thicker layers the drying time is longer. Make sure that the paint on the painting is thoroughly dry.



With matt and satin varnishes the spray can needs to be shaken well before use, to distribute the matting agent throughout the varnish.

The painting and varnish need to be at room temperature. Hold the spray can vertically, do not point downwards, and spray forward so that a mist of varnish descends upon the painting. An additional benefit is that Cobra varnishes are odourless.



If a painting needs to be varnished that is already several years old, it is recommended the surface of the painting is cleaned using a cloth with some white spirit before varnishing.
